## Health Care Workforce Development Appropriation

## An appropriation of \$2,700,000 was made to Board of Regents and specified as follows:

- I. \$1,600,000 "to Delgado Community College for nurse and allied health workforce training"
- 2. \$300,000 "to Southeastern Louisiana University for nursing and allied health programs"
- 3. \$100,000 "for two (2) positions and associated expenses of the Louisiana Health Works Commission"
- 4. \$700,000 "to be allocated specifically for allied health and nursing education programs among the postsecondary educational institutions under the management and supervision of the Louisiana State University Board of Supervisors, the Southern University Board of Supervisors, and the University of Louisiana Board of Supervisors, and community colleges under the management and supervision of the Louisiana Community and Technical Colleges Board of Supervisors"

### Status of allocations:

- 1. Since funding allocations for Delgado Community College and Southeastern Louisiana University were specified in the language of the appropriations act, the transfer of funding to those institutions will be accomplished through interagency transfer agreements between the Board of Regents and the institutions. Commissioner Savoie has requested and the institutions have provided work plans for the funding allocations. Those plans are under review and the transfer of funds should occur as soon as any remaining issues relative to the plans are resolved.
- 2. The transfer of funds for the administrative support of the Louisiana Health Works Commission is underway.
- 3. A plan for use and allocation of the remaining funds has been developed in conjunction with the Health Works Commission and is as follows:
  - \$600,000 is to be used for nursing graduate education stipends directed toward developing additional nursing education faculty. The development of additional nursing education faculty is a critical factor in the production of greater numbers of nurses for the health care workforce. The stipend will provide nursing graduate students 510,000 per semester in support of their pursuit of a Master of Science in Nursing degree. Upon attainment of the degree, the individual will be employed as a faculty member in a nursing education program at a Louisiana public institution and will "repay" the stipend through employment service at the rate of \$10,000 per year of faculty service. This program is modeled after a similar one used before by the state to address nursing shortages in the early 1990's.
  - The balance of the funds will he allocated for the ULM Pharmacy Program to assist in increasing the production of pharmacists.
